- c. 演講(不適用於所有幼兒班):同學將獲發演講題目(見附件三),初賽從該演講 題目中自選一條題目;決賽可自選兩條題目,並於比賽當日從自選兩條中隨機抽出一 條題目,同學將有三分鐘準備時間,並於準備時間結束後,隨即發言,限時不多於 兩分鐘。

#### 8. 比賽模式(決賽,同學須親身出席):

- a. 講故事比賽(適用於所有組別):(中文故事內容不可跟初賽比賽內容相同),不 多於兩分鐘演譯有關故事(見附件一)。
- b. 備稿朗讀:將於決賽日獲發閱讀材料,同學將有三分鐘準備時間,並於準備時間結 束後,隨即發言,不多於兩分鐘朗讀有關文章。
- c. 即席演講:同學可自選兩條題目(見附件三),於比賽當日,從該2條演講題目中 隨機抽出一條,同學將有三分鐘準備時間,並於準備時間結束後,隨即發言,不多 於兩分鐘。(內容不可跟初賽比賽內容相同)

- b. 決賽 2018 年 5 月 12 日(星期六)晚上 8 時公佈入圍同學名單以本會 Facebook 網頁之 最新公佈為準,請密切留意。



#### 15. 獎項:

- A. 各組賽事均設冠、亞、季軍各1名,優異獎10名。得獎者可以獲得創科學會(課程 現金券\$400/\$300/\$200/\$100),亦可申請獎牌乙個。
- b. 凡參與賽事的同學,可獲獎品(課程現金券 \$200)、獎狀或嘉許狀乙張,以茲證明和 鼓勵。
- c. 所有課程現金卷只可用於創科學會的<無線電野外定向>親子活動及暑期活動。現金 券不得轉讓,如遇有爭議,創科學會擁有最終決定權。

- c. 如比賽當日比賽前二小時天文台懸掛「黑色暴雨警告」或「八號或以上颱風警告訊 號」,當天該場比賽即告取消,進一步安排將另行通知。
- d. 本會有權更改比賽場地及比賽時間或取消有關比賽並另行安排,有關安排會於網上 發佈。
- e. 一經報名,不論任何原因,費用概不退還。
